Jayson Haralson rejoins LAFCU as security engineer after previously serving as an IT specialist in 2023. In his new role, he will administer, secure and manage the credit union’s network infrastructure. He also completed the School of Engineering and Management at the Air Force Institute of Technology in Wichita Falls, Texas.
